If we are not able to grow fast enough, we may miss our revenue projections and may not be able to reach profitability. Our target with this \$5M raise is to reach break even; if we aren't able to do that we may need to raise further

We are currently a small team that is growing. If we aren't able to find the right hires for the right position, our growth may be impeded. We have important hires coming up on the sales / marketing side and on software development.

The Company will continue its research and development activities for its initial product and begin its production operations which require capital. There is no certainty that the initial financing will be sufficient to establish that the initial product line is viable, in which case additional development financing will be required. The ability of the Company to secure future capital will depend on many factors, including continued progress in product success, the cost of manufacturing and production, market requirements, advertising costs and fluctuations in raw material prices. The Company does not know whether additional financing will be available when needed, or whether it can be obtained on terms favorable to the Company or its existing investors - particularly in light of current economic conditions, the availability of credit, and other sources of capital. The Company may raise any necessary funds through public or private equity offerings, debt financings or additional corporate collaboration and licensing arrangements. To the extent the

Company raises additional capital by issuing equity securities, the Company's members will experience dilution. If the Company raises funds through debt financings, they may become subject to restrictive covenants. To the extent that the Company raises additional funds through collaboration and product licensing arrangements, the Company may be required to relinquish some rights to the Company's proprietary information or product trade secrets and protected intellectual property, or grant licenses on terms that are not favorable to the Company. If adequate funds are not available, the Company may be required to delay, scale-back or eliminate their research and development programs or obtain funds through collaborative partners or others that may require the Company to relinquish rights to certain of the Company's potential product offerings that they would not otherwise relinquish. There can be no assurance that additional financing will be available on acceptable terms or at all, if and when required.

If our products become subject new government regulation, our ability to profitably manufacture and market our technology may be severely impaired. We are regulated by the FDA, and should they not approve our products at any points in the future that may impair business operations.

Competition. Another company may be better capitalized or resourced and decide to enter our market. Conversely, smaller competitors may be able to iterate more rapidly than we are able to.

Our future success depends on the efforts of a small management team. The loss of services of the members of the management team may have an adverse effect on the company. There can be no assurance that we will be successful in attracting and retaining other personnel we require to successfully grow our business.

The Company may never receive a future equity financing or elect to convert the Securities upon such future financing. In addition, the Company may never undergo a liquidity event such as a sale of the Company or an IPO. If neither the conversion of the Securities nor a liquidity event occurs, the Purchasers could be left holding the Securities in perpetuity. The Securities have numerous transfer restrictions and will likely be highly illiquid, with no secondary market on which to sell them. The Securities are not equity interests, have no ownership rights, have no rights to the Company's assets or profits and have no voting rights or ability to direct the Company or its actions.

which provides Investors the right to **preferred stock** in the Company ("**Preferred Stock**"),

when and if the Company sponsors an equity offering that involves **Preferred** Stock,

on the standard terms offered to other Investors.

Conversion to Preferred Equity. Based on our SAFEs, when we engage in an offering of equity interests involving

Preferred Stock,

Investors will receive a number of shares of Preferred Stock calculated using the method that results in the greater number of **Preferred Stock**:

(i) the total value of the Investor's investment, divided by (a) the price of **Preferred Stock** issued to new Investors multiplied by (b) the **discount rate** (85%), or

(ii) if the valuation for the company is more than **\$49 million** (the "Valuation Cap"), the amount invested by the Investor divided by the quotient of (a) the Valuation Cap divided by (b) the total amount of the Company's capitalization at that time.

Additional Terms of the Valuation Cap.

For purposes of option (ii) above, the Company's

capitalization will be measured as all

 \boldsymbol{shares} of \boldsymbol{stock} outstanding at the time,

not including any SAFEs or convertible notes, plus any

common stock reserved and

available for future grant under any equity incentive or similar plan of the Company or to be created or increased in connection with our equity offering at

that time.

Investors who receive shares subject to the

Valuation Cap will receive a per share liquidation preference and conversion price designed to provide protection against the price of the

Preferred Stock

being diluted to a value below the price per share at the time they receive $\mbox{\bf Preferred Stock}.$

This dilution would

mainly occur due to the issuance of additional stock by the Company.

Investors who receive **Preferred Stock** subject to the Valuation Cap will also receive dividend rights

No Voting Rights.

Investors will have no voting rights.

Instead,

the Company's CEO will be provided a proxy to vote on the Investor's behalf.

Private Sales for Major Investors. Investors who invest at least \$100,000 and are "accredited investors" will receive the right to purchase a pro-rata share of privately placed securities occurring after an equity offering covered by the SAFEs.

Major Investor Threshold

Definition: A major investor is one who invests a minimum of \$100,000.00 and are "accredited investors" as defined by Rule 501 of Regulation D (17 C.F.R. §230.501(a)).

Execution. Investors who invest less than \$100,000.00 will typically not execute transaction documents in order to receive Units at the time of an applicable equity offering. Instead, a "Designated Lead Investor" will execute the documents for them, provided that the documents are consistent with the Units received by new investors in the Company, modified, if applicable, based on the terms of the SAFE.

Liquidity Events.

If the Company has an initial public offering or is acquired by, merged with, or otherwise taken over by another company or new owners prior to Investors in the SAFEs receiving **Preferred Stock**, Investors will receive

shares of common stock equal to the amount invested by the Investor in the SAFEs divided by the quotient of (a) the Valuation Cap divided by (b) the number of outstanding shares of the Company's common stock and Preferred Stock, but excluding any shares of common stock reserved and available for future grant under any equity incentive or grant, SAFEs, and/or convertible promissory notes.

Termination of the Company.

If the Company ceases operations, liquidates, dissolves, winds up or has its assets assigned to creditors prior to an issuance of securities involving **Preferred Stock**, the Company will pay first the other holders of existing

Preferred Stock, based on the terms of the Company's certificate of incorporation, and then holders of the SAFEs. These payments will occur before any distributions to holders of common stock. If there are not sufficient Company assets to pay holders of the SAFEs the amount of their investments, as determined by the Company's board of directors, payments will be made on a pro-rata basis. In this case, Investors

may not recoup part or all of their investment from the Company.

Repurchases

If the Company determines, in its sole discretion, that it is likely that within six months the securities of the Company will be held of record by a number of persons that would require the Company to register a class of its equity securities under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, as required by Section 12(g) thereof, the Company shall have the option to repurchase this instrument from the Investor for the greater of (i) the Purchase Amount and (ii) the fair market value of this instrument, as determined by an independent appraiser of securities chosen by the Company.

We have long term visions that extend beyond 3D food printing. Foodini uses many technologies that can be separated out and integrated into new kitchen solutions. We are already selling globally to professional kitchen markets, and within 5 years we will expand our target market to including the home kitchen market.

Milestone

Natural Machines Inc was incorporated in the State of Delaware in March 2015.

Since then, we have:

- Established company: founded 2012. 7+ years of development and proving the concept/market. First product is in-market and selling globally.
- VC Backed and funded by multiple grants, including European Union H2020 Phase 2 valued at €1.8M.
- IP protected. 7 patents filed to date, covering design, the general process and 5 systems; more patents to come. Patents owned by Natural Machines, Inc.
- Foodini is with over 300 paying customers around the world. We have offices in Barcelona, New York City, Milan and Beijing.
- Large market opportunity: 3D food printing market = \$525M by 2023. Global Food Tech and Kitchen Appliances Market each = \$250B by 2022.
- Over 35 Awards and Recognitions including a Top 10 food innovation that will change the world and regarded as a trailblazer in the industry.

Liquidity & Capital Resources

To-date, the company has been financed with \$1,010,000 in debt, \$2,000,000 in equity, and \$1,488,794 in convertibles.

After the conclusion of this Offering, should we hit our minimum funding target, our projected runway is 9 months before we need to raise further capital.

We plan to use the proceeds as set forth in this Form C under "Use of Funds". We don't have any other sources of capital in the immediate future.

We will likely require additional financing in excess of the proceeds from the Offering in order to perform operations over the lifetime of the Company. We plan to raise capital in 18 months. Except as otherwise described in this Form C, we do not have additional sources of capital other than the proceeds from the offering. Because of the complexities and uncertainties in establishing a new business strategy, it is not possible to adequately project whether the

proceeds of this offering will be sufficient to enable us to implement our strategy. This complexity and uncertainty will be increased if less than the maximum amount of securities offered in this offering is sold. The Company intends to raise additional capital in the future from investors. Although capital may be available for early-stage companies, there is no guarantee that the Company will receive any investments from investors.

Runway & Short/Mid Term Expenses

Natural Machines Inc cash in hand is \$400,000, as of January 2020. Over the last three months, revenues have averaged \$100,000/month, cost of goods sold has averaged \$25,000/month, and operational expenses have averaged \$100,000/month, for an average burn rate of \$25,000 per month. Our intent is to be profitable in 9 months.

We are just about break even right now. Because we've made the investment in most of the R&D that's needed, we are expecting (although cannot guarantee) that we can become profitable relatively quickly. As we grow over the course of the next 6 - 12 months, we are hopeful that will be able to maintain profitability. Our total goal for this round (including the funds raised through Reg CF) is \$2,000,000.

Our main expenses are the team, and the secondary source of expense is the production setup. We don't foresee any major unforeseen expenses. We do plan to raise capital in the next 18 months after this \$2M raise after hitting our targets (positive cash flow).

Six months following the raise, we expect monthly revenues to be in the range of 100k-150k monthly. That can change upwards in the moment we rollout some additional products.
