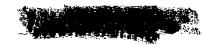

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENT

AS OF JUNE 30, 2003

NOTE 1 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Company records commission revenue net of related expenses on a trade date basis.

Furniture, equipment and leasehold improvements are carried at cost. Depreciation of furniture and equipment including amortization of assets held under capital leases, is computed on either an accelerated or straight-line method over the estimated useful life of such assets. Leasehold improvements are amortized over the lesser of their economic lives or the remaining term of the lease.

As a partnership, the Company is not subject to Federal or State income taxes, but is subject to New York City Unincorporated Business Tax.

NOTE 2 - NET CAPITAL REQUIREMENT

As a registered municipal securities brokers' broker and member of the National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc. the Company is subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission's Uniform Net Capital Rule which requires that the Company maintain minimum net capital, as defined, of 6-2/3% of aggregate indebtedness, as defined, or \$150,000, whichever is greater. At June 30, 2003, the Company had net capital of \$491,548, which exceeded the requirements by \$197,532.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE

The carrying amounts reflected in the Statement of Financial Condition for cash and bank loan payable approximate their respective fair values due to the short maturities of the instruments.

NOTE 4 - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The Company is obligated under leases for its office space expiring at various dates through December 31, 2005, which provide for minimum lease payments as follows:

The Company has an outstanding letter of credit in the amount of \$500,000 issued to its landlord in lieu of a cash security deposit. The letter of credit expires March 1, 2004 and may be extended from time to time.

The Company has an outstanding letter of credit in the amount of \$750,000 issued in lieu of a clearing deposit. The letter of credit expires September 1, 2003 and may be extended from time to time.

The Company has entered in a \$1,000,000 revolving credit line agreement with Citibank. The agreement contains various covenants, which place restrictions on loan repayment or extensions. At June 30, 2003 the Company has not drawn down against the credit line.

Counsel has advised that there is no litigation of a material nature pending against the Company.
