This financial statement is the responsibility of the Company's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on this financial statement based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement is free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statement. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

In our opinion, the statement of financial condition referred to above presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Ogilvie Security Advisors Corporation at June 30, 2003 in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

Note 1 Nature of Operations and Significant Accounting Policies

Nature of Operations—Ogilvie Security Advisors Corporation (the "Company") is a registered broker-dealer, investment advisor and general insurance agent, and provides variable life and annuity contracts, investment company products, and other investment services to individual and corporate clients located throughout the United States. The Company introduces customers on a fully disclosed basis to other brokers and investment advisors.

Use of Estimates—The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash Equivalents—Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments purchased with a maturity of three months or less.

Securities Owned—Securities owned are valued at fair market value and consist of equity mutual funds of \$34,502 and common stocks of \$67,511 at June 30, 2003.

Income Recognition—Concessions and commissions earned on securities transactions and related commission expense are recorded on trade date. Concessions and commissions earned on partnership syndications and mutual funds and related commission expense are recorded on transaction date. Commissions earned on variable life and annuity contracts and related commission expense are recorded on the effective date of the contracts.

Note 2 Related-Party Transactions

The Company has an agreement with an affiliated company owned by the Company's common stockholder that provides that the affiliate pay for certain costs of operation, including but not limited to employee compensation and benefits, office space, utilities and administrative services.

Note 3 Commitments and Contingencies

In the normal course of business, the Company is subject to litigation and arbitration matters. The Company vigorously defends claims arising from such matters and, in the opinion of management, their resolution will not result in any material adverse effect on the Company's financial position.

Note 4 Off-Balance-Sheet and Financial Instrument Risk

Securities transactions of customers are introduced to and cleared through the Company's clearing broker on a fully disclosed basis, and under the terms of its clearing agreement, the Company is required to guarantee the performance of its customers in meeting contracted obligations. In conjunction with the clearing broker, the Company seeks to minimize the risks associated with its customer activities by requiring customers to maintain collateral in compliance with various regulatory and internal guidelines. Compliance with these guidelines is monitored daily and, accordingly, the customers may be required to deposit additional collateral, or reduce positions where necessary.

Amounts due from the clearing broker represent a concentration of credit risk. The Company has a policy of reviewing, as considered necessary, the creditworthiness of the clearing broker with which it conducts business. The Company does not anticipate nonperformance by customers or its clearing broker.

The Company maintains cash in bank accounts that, at times, exceeds federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts. Management believes the Company is not exposed to significant credit risk on cash.

Note 5 Net Capital Requirements

The Company is a broker-dealer subject to the Securities and Exchange Commission Uniform Net Capital Rule (Rule 15c3-1). The Company is required to maintain "net capital" equal to 6-2/3 percent of "aggregate indebtedness" or \$50,000, whichever is greater, as these terms are defined.

Adjusted net capital and aggregate indebtedness change from day to day, but at June 30, 2003, the Company had net capital and net capital requirements of approximately \$219,000 and \$78,000, respectively. The net capital rule may effectively restrict the payment of cash dividends.
