Note 1 - Organization and Nature of Business

Mundial Financial Group, LLC, (the "Company") was incorporated in the State of California on January 11, 2008. The Company is a registered broker-dealer with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority ("FINRA") and the Securities Investor Protection Corporation ("SIPC").

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation – The Company conducts the following types of business as a securities broker- dealer, which comprises several classes of services, including:

- Broker or dealer retailing corporate equity securities over-the-counter
- Broker or dealer selling corporate debt securities
- Underwriter or selling group participant (corporate securities other than mutual funds)
- Mutual fund retailer
- U.S. government securities broker
- Put and call broker or dealer or option writer
- Non-exchange member arranging for transactions in listed securities by exchange member
- Private placements of securities

Under its membership agreement with FINRA and pursuant to Rule 15c3 (k) (2) (ii), the Company conducts business on a fully disclosed basis and does not execute or clear securities transactions for customers. Accordingly, the Company is exempt from the requirement of Rule 15c3-3 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 pertaining to the possession or control of customer assets and reserve requirements.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Securities Inventory - Securities inventory is valued at current market.

Revenue Recognition - The Company recognizes revenue upon rendering of services. In the case where restricted stock is received the value of the services are valued at the value of the stock at the time they are received in lieu of cash.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Income Taxes - The Company, with consent of its Members, has elected to be a California Limited Liability Company. For tax purposes the Company is treated like a partnership, therefore in lieu of business income taxes, the Member is taxed on the Company's taxable income. Therefore, no provision or liability for Federal Income Taxes is included in these financial statements. The State of California has a similar treatment, although there exists a provision for a gross receipts tax and a minimum Franchise Tax of \$800.

Note 3 - Fair Value

FASB ASC 820 defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. A fair value measurement assumes that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability occurs in the principal market for the asset or liability or, in the absence of a principal market, the most advantageous market. Valuation techniques that are consistent with the market, income or cost approach, as specified by FASB ASC 820, are used to measure fair value.

The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value into three broad levels:

- Level 1 inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities the Company has the ability to access.
- Level 2 inputs are inputs (other than quoted prices included within level 1) that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability and rely on
 management's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants
 would use in pricing the asset or liability. (The unobservable inputs should be
 developed based on the best information available in the circumstances and may
 include the Company's own data.)

Note 5 - Related Party

The Company shares its office space with an entity that is managed by an officer of another Company, Glendale Securities, Inc. and the two companies are deemed under common control. The Company has an Expense Sharing Agreement with Glendale Securities, Inc. Expenses for the year ending December 31, 2016 were as follows:

The Company owed \$3,624 to its affiliate at December 31, 2016.

Note 6 - Net Capital Requirements

The Company is subject to the SEC Uniform Net Capital Rule (SEC Rule 15c3-1), which requires the maintenance of minimum net capital and requires that the ratio of aggregate indebtedness to net capital, both as defined, shall not exceed 15 to 1. Rule 15c3-1 also provides that equity capital may not be withdrawn or cash dividends paid if the resulting net capital ratio would exceed 10 to 1. At December 31, 2016, the Company had net capital of \$7,693 which was \$2,693 in excess of its required net capital of \$5,000. The Company's net capital ratio was .54 to 1.

Note 7 - Operating Lease

The Company shares its office with a related party through an expense sharing agreement. (See Note 5) Rent expense for the year ended December 31, 2016 was \$2,432.

Note 8 - Income Taxes

The Company is treated as a partnership for federal income tax purposes. Consequently, federal income taxes are not payable by or provided by the Company. Members are taxed individually on their shares of the Company's earnings. The Company's net income or loss is allocated among the members in accordance with the operating agreement of the Company. The State of California requires limited liability companies to pay a minimum \$800 tax plus a fee based on gross revenue. The accompanying financial statements include an \$800 minimum tax. The company is subject to examinations by U.S. Federal and State tax authorities from 2012 to the present, generally for three years after they are filed.

Note 9 - Clearing Broker Deposit

The Company has an agreement with Electronic Transaction Clearing Inc which requires a \$10,001 minimum deposit.

Note 10 - SIPC Supplementary Report Requirement

The Company is not required to complete the SIPC Supplementary Report under SEC Rule 17a-5(e) (4) for fiscal year ending December 31, 2016 because the Company's SIPC Net Operating Revenues are under \$500,000.

Note 11 - Exemption from the SEC Rule 15c3-3

Mundial Financial Group, LLC is an introducing broker-dealer that clears all transactions with and for customers on a fully disclosed basis with an independent securities clearing company and promptly transmits all customer funds and securities to the clearing company, which carries all of the accounts of such customers and maintains and preserves such books and records pertaining thereto pursuant to the requirements of the SEC Rule 17a-3 and 17a-4, as are customarily made and kept by a clearing broker or dealer.

Note 12 - Subsequent Events

Management has reviewed the results of operations for the period of time from its year end December 31, 2016 through February 25, 2017, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that no adjustments are necessary to the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements nor have any subsequent events occurred, the nature of which would require disclosure.
