RE: Meeting with Representatives of SIFMA

On November 2, 2016, staff from the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC), the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System (FRB), the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC), the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA), and the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) met with representatives from the Securities Industry and Financial Markets Association (SIFMA), Barclays, the Bank of New York Mellon (BNY Mellon), Cleary Gottlieb Steen & Hamilton LLP (Cleary Gottlieb), Davis Polk & Wardell LLP (Davis Polk), Fidelity, Goldman Sachs Bank USA (Goldman Sachs), Janney Montgomery Scott LLC (Janney), JP Morgan Chase, Morgan Stanley, Nomura Holding America Inc. (Nomura), Schwab, TD Ameritrade, and U.S. Bank. The representatives shared SIFMA's views on the proposed Incentive-Based Compensation Arrangements rule.
