Please, do not allow Natural Asset Companies to be listed on the New York Stock Exchange.

I am 76 years old and live on a small, 20-acre farm. Please know that I believe and concur with the many U.S. Attorneys General who now are saying in concert that allowing "natural asset companies" to be **publicly traded** would be counter to laws meant to protect investors and the public—I am an investor—I am the Public. As the owners of a small farm, my family believes what has been said: Natural asset companies would halt farming, grazing, mining, logging and drilling and would likely never generate any revenue, leaving the United States poorer and more reliant on foreign countries for vital resources. My family and I are aware of this environmental scheme based on elitest, want-to-grab-power ambitions.
