Virginia 22312, and shall be accompanied by a letter identifying

Berlin as a defendant in this action; setting forth the title and

civil action number of this action and the name of this Court;

and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this Final

Judgment. A copy of the check and letter shall be simultaneously

II.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the Consent is incorporated herein with the same force and effect as if fully set forth herein, and that Berlin shall comply with all of the undertakings and agreements set forth therein.

III.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purposes of enforcing the terms of this Final Judgment.

IV.

There being no just reason for delay, pursuant to Rule 54(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Clerk is ordered to enter this Final Judgment forthwith and without further notice.
