FINAL JUDGMENT AS TO DEFENDANT CHANDRAMOWLI SRINIVASAN

The Securities and Exchange Commission having filed a Complaint and Defendant
Chandramowli Srinivasan having entered a general appearance; consented to the Court's
jurisdiction over Defendant and the subject matter of this action; consented to entry of this Final
Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations of the Complaint (except as to
jurisdiction); waived findings of fact and conclusions of law; and waived any right to appeal
from this Final Judgment:

I.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant and Defendant's agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently restrained and enjoined from violating, directly or indirectly, Section

13(b)(5) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 ("Exchange Act") and Rule 13b2-1 thereunder [15 U.S.C. § 78m(b)(5) and 17 C.F.R. § 240.13b2-1] by:

- (1) knowingly circumventing or knowingly failing to implement a system of internal controls or knowingly falsifying any book, record, or account described in Section 13(b)(2) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78m(b)(2)] or
- (2) directly or indirectly falsifying or causing to be falsified, any book, record or account subject to Section 13(b)(2)(A) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78m(b)(2)(A)].

Π.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant and Defendant's agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently restrained and enjoined from violating, directly or indirectly, Section 30A of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 78dd-1]. By making use of the mails or any means or instrumentality of interstate commerce corruptly in furtherance of an offer, payment, promise to pay, or authorizations of the payment of any money, or offer, gift, promise to give, or authorization of the giving of anything of value to:

- (1) any foreign official for purposes of:
 - a. (i) influencing any act or decision of such foreign official in his official
 capacity, (ii) inducing such foreign official to do or omit to do any act in
 violation of the lawful duty of such official, or (iii) securing any improper
 advantage; or

- inducing such foreign official to use his influence with a foreign government or instrumentality thereof to affect or influence any act or decision of such government or instrumentality,
- in order to assist any issuer which has a class of securities registered pursuant to Exchange Act Section 12 [15 U.S.C. § 781] or which is required to file reports under Exchange Act Section 15(d) [15 U.S.C. § 780(d)], in obtaining or retaining business for or with, or directing business to, any person;
- any foreign political party or official thereof or any candidate for foreign political office for purpose of:
 - a. (i) influencing any act or decision of such party, official, or candidate in its or in his official capacity, (ii) inducing such party, official, or candidate to do or omit to do any act in violation of the lawful duty of such party, official, or candidate, or (iii) securing any improper advantage; or
 - inducing such party, official, or candidate to use its or his influence with a
 foreign government or instrumentality thereof to affect or influence any act or
 decision of such government or instrumentality,
 - in order to assist any issuer which has a class of securities registered pursuant to Exchange Act Section 12 [15 U.S.C. § 781] or which is required to file reports under Exchange Act Section 15(d) [15 U.S.C. § 780(d)], in obtaining or retaining business for or with, or directing business to, any person; or
- (3) any person, while knowing that all or a portion of such money or thing of value will be offered, given, or promised, directly or indirectly, to any foreign official, to

- any foreign political party or official thereof, or to any candidate for foreign political office for purposes of:
- a. (i) influencing any act or decision of such foreign official, political party, party official, or candidate in his or its official capacity, (ii) inducing such foreign official, political party, party official, or candidate to do or omit to do any act in violation of the lawful duty of such foreign official, political party, party official, or candidate, or (iii) securing any improper advantage; or
- b. inducing such foreign official, political party, party official, or candidate to use his or its influence with a foreign government or instrumentality thereof to affect or influence any act or decision of such government or instrumentality, in order to assist any issuer which has a class of securities registered pursuant to Exchange Act Section 12 [15 U.S.C. § 781] or which is required to file reports under Exchange Act Section 15(d) [15 U.S.C. § 780(d)], in obtaining or retaining business for or with, or directing business to, any person.

III.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$70,000 pursuant to Sections 21(d)(3) and 32(c) of the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. §§ 78u(d)(3) and 78ff(c)]. Defendant shall make this payment within ten (10) business days after entry of this Final Judgment by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money order payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission. The payment shall be delivered or mailed to the Office of Financial Management, Securities and Exchange Commission, Operations Center, 6432 General Green Way, Mail Stop 0-3, Alexandria,

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Virginia 22312, and shall be accompanied by a letter identifying Chandramowli Srinivasan as a defendant in this action; setting forth the title and civil action number of this action and the name of this Court; and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this Final Judgment. Defendant shall simultaneously transmit photocopies of such payment and letter to Kenneth Lench,

Assistant Director, Securities and Exchange Commission, 100 F Street, N.E., Washington, D.C.

20549. Defendant shall pay post-judgment interest on any delinquent amounts pursuant to 28

USC § 1961. The Commission shall remit the funds paid pursuant to this paragraph to the United States Treasury.

IV.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the Consent is incorporated herein with the same force and effect as if fully set forth herein, and that Defendant shall comply with all of the undertakings and agreements set forth therein.

V.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for the purposes of enforcing the terms of this Final Judgment.
