FINAL JUDGMENT AS TO MARK T. TURKCAN

- 1. On July 9, 2009, the Court entered an order of permanent injunction against
 Defendant Mark T. Turkcan ("Defendant") ("Order of Permanent Injunction") [Docket No. 14]
 that, *inter alia*: permanently enjoined Defendant from violating sections of the Securities
 Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Exchange Act") and the Securities Act of 1933 ("Securities Act")
 and certain rules promulgated thereunder; permanently enjoined Defendant from serving as an
 officer or director of any issuer that has a class of securities registered pursuant to Section 12 of
 the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 781] or that is required to file reports pursuant to Section 15(d) of
 the Exchange Act [15 U.S.C. § 780(d)]; and provided that the Commission could move for
 disgorgement of ill-gotten gains, prejudgment interest thereon, and/or civil penalties, in amounts
 to be determined by the Court at a hearing to be held upon motion of the Commission.
- 2. Since the Court entered the Order of Permanent Injunction, the Commission has elected to dismiss any claims for disgorgement, prejudgment interest thereon, and/or civil penalties against Defendant provided for in Section X of that Order.

- 3. Accordingly, the Court enters final judgment in the present matter, which includes and incorporates herein the relief previously imposed in the Order of Permanent Injunction [Docket No. 14], and dismisses the Commission's claims for disgorgement, prejudgment interest thereon, and/or civil penalties against Defendant provided for in Section X of the Order of Permanent Injunction.
 - 4. Each party shall bear its own costs in this matter.
- 5. The Court retains jurisdiction of this matter for the purposes of enforcing the terms of this Order and the Order of Permanent Injunction.
