ORDER POSTPONING HEARING AND SCHEDULING PREHEARING CONFERENCE

The Securities and Exchange Commission (Commission) issued an Order Instituting Administrative Proceedings (OIP) on September 23, 2013. The OIP alleges that Respondents have securities registered with the Commission pursuant to Section 12(g) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and that they have not filed periodic reports required by Exchange Act Section 13(a) and Exchange Act Rules 13a-1 and/or 13a-13. Respondents are required to answer the OIP within ten days of service of the OIP. See OIP at 4; 17 C.F.R. § 201.220(b). On October 1, 2013, the Division of Enforcement filed the Declaration of Neil J. Welch Jr. to Assist Secretary with Record of Service (Declaration). The Declaration shows that all Respondents except Ultimate Indoor Football League, Inc., were served with the OIP by September 27, 2013. See 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(ii).

The OIP was sent to Ultimate Indoor Football League, Inc. (Ultimate Indoor Football), at 77 Acom Ave., while the address on Ultimate Indoor Football's most recent filing was 77 Acom Ave. The OIP was returned to the Commission as "undeliverable as addressed." I do not find that service was accomplished as to this Respondent.

## **Order**

Based on these facts, I POSTPONE the hearing scheduled to begin on October 18, 2013, and ORDER a telephonic prehearing conference on Friday, November 1, 2013, at 3:00 p.m. EDT. I will default any Respondent that has been served with the OIP that does not file an Answer, appear
