Cono Italiano, Inc., Native American Energy Group, Inc., Plures Technologies, Inc., and Secured Technology Innovations Corp. Order to Show Cause, Postpone Hearing, and Schedule Prehearing Conference

The Securities and Exchange Commission issued an order instituting proceedings (OIP) pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 on September 13, 2017, alleging that Respondents have securities registered with the Commission and are delinquent in their periodic filings.

On October 2, 2017, the Division of Enforcement submitted a declaration establishing that Respondents Cono Italiano, Inc., Native American Energy Group, Inc., and Secured Technology Innovations Corp. were served with the OIP by September 15, 2017, in accordance with Commission Rule of Practice 141(a)(2)(ii). See 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(ii). Per the Division's declaration, a delinquency letter sent to Respondent Plures Technologies, Inc., at the address on its most recent filing with the Commission was returned because Respondent no longer occupied that address. Therefore, the Office of the Secretary mailed a copy of the OIP to Plures's forwarding address and obtained confirmation that delivery occurred on September 15, 2017. 17 C.F.R. § 201.141(a)(2)(i). Respondents' answers were due by September 28, 2017. See OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.160(b), .220(b). To date, no Respondent has submitted an answer.

I ORDER Respondents to SHOW CAUSE by October 12, 2017, why the registration of their securities should not be revoked by default due to their failures to file answers or otherwise defend the proceeding. *See* OIP at 3; 17 C.F.R. §§ 201.155(a), .220(f).

I POSTPONE the hearing currently scheduled for October 10, 2017. I ORDER a telephonic prehearing conference for October 16, at  $3:00~\rm p.m.$  Eastern.
