FINAL JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION AND OTHER EQUITABLE RELIEF AGAINST GARY D. REEDER

Plaintiff Securities and Exchange Commission ("Commission"), having filed its

Complaint in this matter and defendant Gary D. Reeder ("Reeder"), through his Stipulation
and Consent ("Consent"), having admitted service of the Complaint and waived service of
the summons, having admitted the jurisdiction of this Court over him, having waived the
entry of findings of facts and conclusions of law pursuant to Rule 52 of the Federal Rules
of Civil Procedure, having entered into his Consent voluntarily, no threats, promises of
immunity or assurances having been made by the Commission or by any of its members,
officers, agents or representatives to induce Reeder to enter into his Consent, having
consented, without admitting or denying any of the allegations in the Commission's

Complaint, except as to jurisdiction as set forth above, to entry without further notice of this

Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief ("Fina Jucgment")

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enjoining defendant Reeder from engaging in transactions, acts, practices and courses of business which constitute and would constitute violations of Sections 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, [15 U.S.C. §§ 77e(a), 77e(c) and 77(q)(a)], Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, [15 U.S.C. §78j(b)], and Rule 10b-5 thereunder [17 C.F.R. §240.10b-5]; and it further appearing that this Court has jurisdiction over defendant Reeder and over the subject matter of this action and that no further notice of hearing for the entry of this Final Judgment need be given; and the Court being fully advised in the premises:

I.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that defendant Reeder and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys-in-fact and all other persons in active concert or participation with him who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise, be and hereby are permanently restrained and enjoined, directly or indirectly, in connection with the purchase or sale of securities, in the form of investment contracts, notes or any other security, from making use of any means or instrumentalities of interstate commerce or of the mails, or of any facility of any national securities exchange:

- (a) to employ any device, scheme or artifice to defraud;
- (b) to make any untrue statement of a material fact or omit to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or
- (c) to engage in any act, practice or course of business which operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon any person.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that defendant Reeder

and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys-in-fact and all other persons in active concert or participation with him who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise, and each of them, be and hereby are permanently restrained and enjoined, in the offer or sale of securities, in the form of investment contracts, notes or any other security, from making use of any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate commerce, or of the mails, directly or indirectly:

- (a) to employ any device, scheme or artifice to defraud;
- (b) to obtain money or property by means of any untrue statement of a material fact or any omission to state a material fact necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances under which they were made, not misleading; or
- (c) to engage in any transaction, practice or course of business which operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon any purchaser.

III.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that defendant Reeder and his agents, servants, employees, attorneys-in-fact and all other persons in active concert or participation with him who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise, and each of them, be and hereby are permanently restrained and enjoined from, in the absence of any applicable exemption, directly or indirectly:

(a) making use of any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate commerce or of the mails to sell the securities of any issuer, through the use or medium of any prospectus or otherwise, unless and until a registration statement is in effect as to such securities;

- (b) carrying or causing to be carried through the mails or in interstate commerce, by any means or instruments of transportation, for the purpose of sale or for delivery after sale, the securities of any issuer, unless and until a registration statement is in effect as to such securities; or
- (c) making use of any means or instruments of transportation or communication in interstate commerce or of the mails to offer to sell or offer to buy through the use or medium of any prospectus or otherwise the securities of any issuer, unless and until a registration statement has been filed with the Commission as to such securities, or while a registration statement as to such securities is the subject of a refusal order or stop order or (prior to the effective date of the registration statement) any public proceeding of examination under Section 8 of the Securities Act [15 U.S.C. § 77h].

IV.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that defendant Reeder shall pay disgorgement, jointly and severally with Defendant Sandra Reeder, in the amount of \$16.5 million, less the total assets retrieved by the Court-Appointed Receiver (currently in excess of \$6 million), representing his gains from the conduct alleged in the Complaint, plus prejudgment interest. Based upon defendant Reeder's sworn representations in his Sworn Statement of Financial Condition dated February 15, 2000, and submitted to the Commission, payment of the above-referenced disgorgement and all prejudgment interest thereon is waived, contingent upon the accuracy and completeness of his Sworn Statement of Financial Condition. Defendant Reeder has assigned to the Receiver all interest in, and waived all claims to, the funds and assets in the Receiver's possession.

V.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that, based upon defendant Reeder's sworn representations in his Sworn Statement of Financial Condition dated February 15, 2000, and submitted to the Commission, the Court is not ordering him to pay a civil money penalty pursuant to the provisions of Section 20(d) of the Securities Act of 1933, [15 U.S.C. §77t(d)], and Section 21(d)(3) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, [15 U.S.C. §78u(d)(3)]. The determination not to impose a civil penalty and to waive payment of a portion of the disgorgement amount and all prejudgment interest thereon is contingent upon the accuracy and completeness of defendant Reeder's Sworn Statement of Financial Condition. If at any time following the entry of this Final Judgment, the Commission obtains information indicating that defendant Reeder's representations to the Commission concerning his assets, income, liabilities or net worth were fraudulent, misleading, inaccurate or incomplete in any material respect as of the time such representations were made, the Commission may, at its sole discretion and without prior notice to Reeder, petition this Court for an order requiring Reeder to pay all disgorgement previously waived, plus prejudgment and post-judgment interest thereon, and a civil penalty. In connection with any such petition, the only issues shall be whether the financial information provided by defendant Reeder was fraudulent, misleading, inaccurate or incomplete in any material respect as of the time such representations were made, and the amount of civil penalty to be imposed. In its petition, the Commission may move this Court to consider all available remedies, including, but not limited to, ordering defendant Reeder to turn over funds and assets, directing the forfeiture of any assets, or sanctions for contempt of this Final Judgment, and the Commission may also request additional discovery. Defendant Reeder may not, by way of defense to such petition, challenge the validity of his Consent or this Final Judgment, contest the allegations in the Complaint filed by the Commission or the amount of disgorgement and interest, or assert that disgorgement or payment of a civil penalty should not be ordered.

VI.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the Consent filed herein be, and the same is hereby, incorporated in this Final Judgment with the same force and effect as if fully set forth herein.

VII.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this action for all purposes, including for purposes of entertaining any suitable application or motion by the Commission for additional relief within the jurisdiction of this Court, including but not limited to the relief requested by the Commission in its Complaint in this action.

VIII.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that this Final Judgment may be served upon defendant Reeder in person or by mail either by the United States marshal, by the Clerk of the Court or by any member of the staff of the Commission.
