Dear Judge Grimes:

Pursuant to your July 28, 2015 notice, all of your points were read and carefully considered by me. I wish to express my disappointment in this SEC process. The criminal case has been described as being the largest insurance case in the history of the Eastern District of Missouri. There were over 80 million documents. As I pointed out in my last letter to you, term and simple whole life insurance are not securities and thus are not regulated by your agency. Additionally, the nature of a non-discretionary advisory contract are of critical importance. The complexity of this case requires careful discernment and rational thought. I believe there are major points in my case that are not being heeded. While I adamantly deny the criminal charges against me, you describe only your "recitation" of these allegations and not the actual allegations themselves. It is not surprising to me to read of and hear about the many controversies involving the SEC administrative courts versus the U.S. Constitution. I hereby express my formal request for a review of this matter.
