ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO SUBMIT SUPPLEMENTAL BRIEFING

On August 15, 2023, William Joseph Kielczewski filed a motion requesting leave to submit supplemental briefing addressing the constitutionality of the process by which the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority ("FINRA") disciplined him. Kielczewski asked for leave to address (1) whether the process used to appoint FINRA hearing officers violates the U.S. Constitution's Appointments Clause; (2) whether the process to remove FINRA hearing officers violates the Constitution's separation of power guarantees; (3) whether the Constitution's due process and jury trial requirements apply to this proceeding; and (4) whether, because "FINRA's disciplinary scheme relies on an unconstitutional structure" this proceeding "should be vacated or, at a minimum, stayed pending resolution in *Alpine [Securities Corp. v. Financial Industry Regulatory Authority*]."¹ FINRA opposes Kielczewski's motion.

We have determined to grant Kielczewski's request for additional briefing.² Accordingly, it is ORDERED that Kielczewski file a supplemental brief, not to exceed twentyfive double-spaced pages, addressing the issues that he raises in his motion, by October 17, 2023.
