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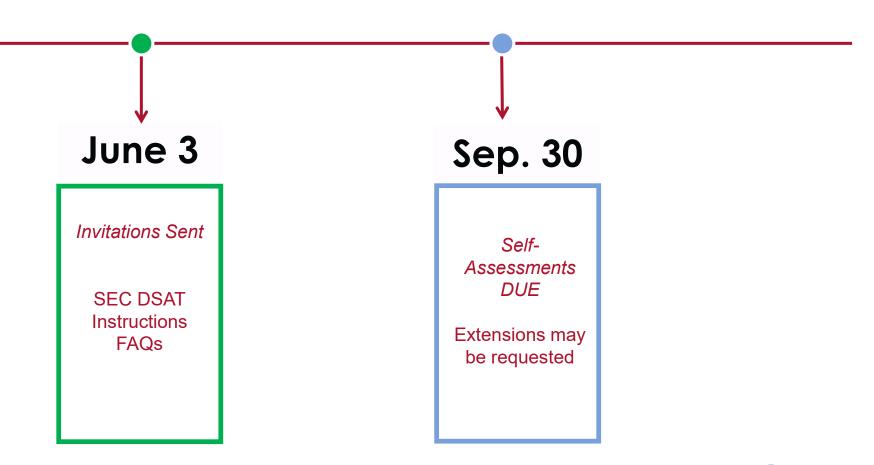
BACKGROUND AND HISTORY



- Section 342 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (Dodd-Frank Act)
- Joint Standards (June 10, 2015)
- OMB Approval for Collection of Information (February 18, 2016)
- 2018 Collection by SEC OMWI



2024 COLLECTION PERIOD



DIVERSITY SELFASSESSMENT TOOL (DSAT)

Purpose

SEC OMWI developed the DSAT to:

- Help guide self-assessments of diversity policies and practices
- Provide a template for submitting diversity assessment information to OMWI

2023 Revision

- Renamed (DAR to DSAT)
- Opt-in for publishing name of firm as having submitted a DSAT*
- Combined and removed some items
- Added clarifying language to some items
- Shortened items for brevity

^{*} Information collected aggregated in a form that does not identify a particular entity or disclose confidential business information

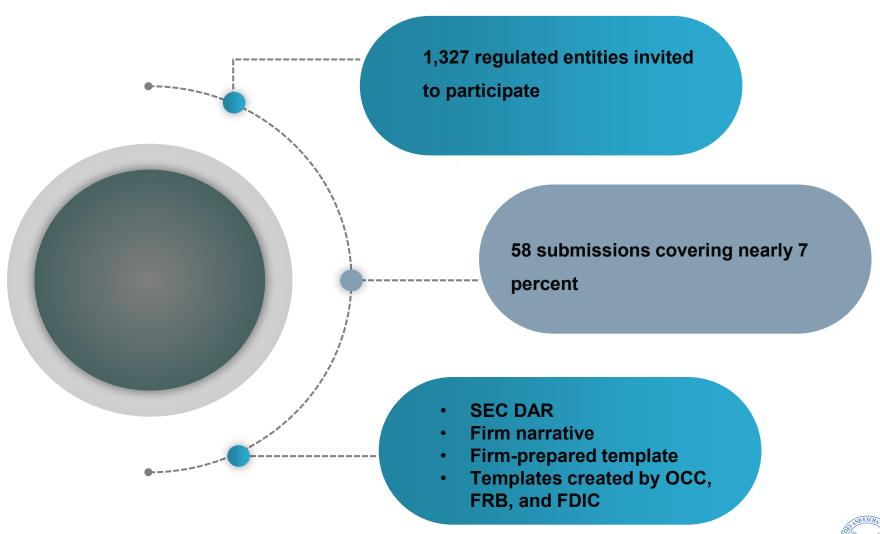




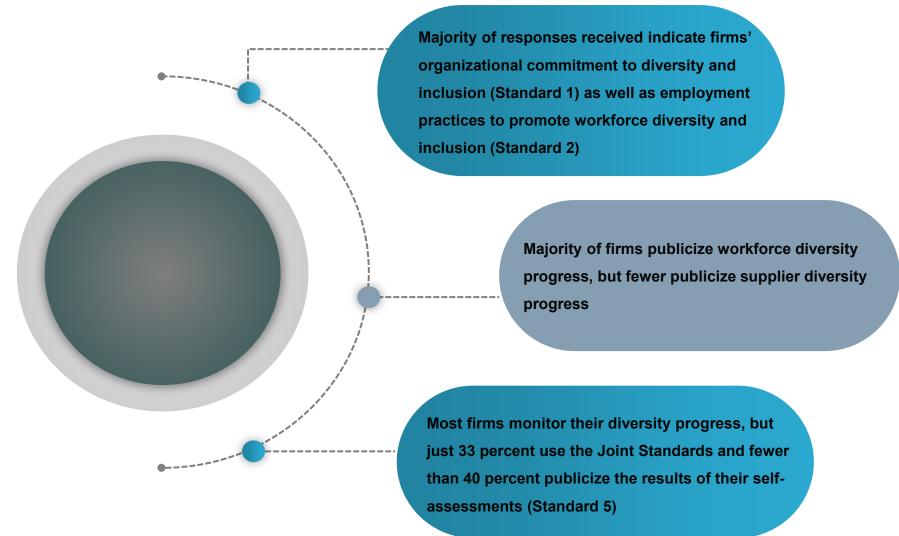
