DECISION IN ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

HEARING EXAMINER DENIES APPLICATION OF IOWA BEEF PROCESSORS, INC. Chief Hearing Examiner Warren E. Blair has filed an initial decision which denies the application of Iowa Beef Processors, Inc., of Dakota City, Nebr., for an exemption from the requirement to file quarterly reports on Form 10-Q pursuant to Rule 13a-13 under the Securities Exchange Act. The decision is subject to review by the Commission either on its own motion or on petition of the company.

The Examiner found that the company had not carried its burden of establishing that the exemption should be granted, and concluded that the filing of quarterly reports would be in the public interest in view of the present and probably continuing market activity of the stock which is listed on the New York Stock Exchange, the number of holders of the company's securities, the likely utility of its quarterly reports, and the interest of financial publications in information about the company.

COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENT

SEC CITES JANRU OPTIONS CORP. The Commission has ordered administrative proceedings against Janru Options Corporation, a brokerage firm whose principal place of business is located at 99 Wall St., New York, N. Y. and against Donald G. Rush the owner of Janru Options Corporation. The proceedings are based on staff allegations that the aforementioned respondents were in violation of the anti-fraud, net capital, bookkeeping and financial reporting provisions of the Federal securities laws and that on June 30, 1971 the respondents were permanently enjoined from further violations of said provisions.

A public hearing will be scheduled by further order to afford respondents an opportunity to refute the staff's allegations and to establish any defenses, and to determine, what, if any, remedial action is appropriate in the public interest.

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

WHITE AND MELODY ENTER GUILTY PLEAS. The SEC Fort Worth Regional Office announced August 20 that Douglas Jack White, of Austin, Texas, and Joseph Edward Melody, of Houston, entered pleas of guilty to one count of a ten-count indictment charging them and others with conspiracy to violate the registration and anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of securities of Melrose Park Baptist Church, Houston. Sentencing was deferred until the trial of the two remaining defendants is completed. (LR-5148)

JONES AND MORAITES CHARGED. The SEC New York Regional Office announced August 25 that the Federal Grand Jury in Newark, N.J. has returned a 16-count indictment charging Walter H. Jones, Norwood, N.J., and Peter Moraites, Alpine, N.J., with, among other things, violations of the antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws and conspiracy to commit such violations in connection with the merger of the Midland Bank and Trust Company, Paramus, N.J., and the Englewood National Bank and Trust Company in 1968 and the recapitalization of Midland Bank and Trust Company, Paramus, N.J. by the sale of additional stock to its shareholders and to the public in 1969. FAR WESTERN SECURITIES ENJOINED. The SEC San Francisco Regional Office and Los Angeles Branch Office jointly announced on August 26 that the Federal court in Tucson, Arizona had permanently enjoined Far Western Securities, Inc., a Tucson broker-dealer, from doing business while in violation of the net capital provisions of the Federal securities laws. The court also appointed Thomas A. Latta as receiver until such time as the Securities Investors Protection Corporation determines whether or not to apply to the Court for appointment of a trustee. Far Western consented to the court order without admitting or denying the allegations. (LR-5150)

SEC COMPLAINT NAMES COMMONWEALTH SECURITIES CORP., OTHERS. The SEC Atlanta Regional Office announced August 25 the filing of a complaint in the Federal Court in Nashville, Tenn. seeking to enjoin Commonwealth Securities Corporation, Nashville broker-dealer, and Jack E. Friedman, its president, also of Nashville, from violations of the net capital, hypothecation, bookkeeping and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in doing business with customers. Appointment of a receiver for Commonwealth was requested pending a determination by the Securities Investor Protection Corporation whether to apply for installation of a trustee of Commonwealth under the SIPA. A hearing has been set for September 3. (LR-5151)

OVER

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GENERAL HOST. The SEC has issued a notice under the Investment Company Act giving interested persons until September 20 to request a hearing upon an application of General Host Corporation, New York declaring that it is not an investment company as defined in the Act.

The company asserts that it has been primarily engaged in a business other than that of investing, reinvesting, owning, holding or trading in securities, that historically it has been an operating company primarily engaged in the baking industry and has diversified through the acquisition of operating entities. General Host represents that its acquisition of 55% of the outstanding common stock of Armour & Company in 1968 and 85% of the voting securities of Cudahy Company in 1971 was in the interest of obtaining operating control of those companies. Its subsequent sale of Armour stock of The Greyhound Corp. in 1970 resulted from a deterioration of the money market which made it difficult to acquire the financing necessary to obtain operating control of Armour. 1/ (Release IC-6704)

NORTHERN INVESTMENT FUND. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act upon an application of Northern Investment Fund of the Northern Trust Company, Chicago, declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. (Release IC-6705)

NORTHERN GROWTH FUND. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act upon an application of Northern Growth Fund of the Northern Trust Company, Chicago, for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. (Release IC-6706)

NORTHERN MUNICIPAL BOND FUND. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act upon an application of Northern Municipal Bond Fund of The Northern Trust Company, Chicago, declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. (Release IC-6707)

SCHOONER CAPITAL CORP. The SEC has issued a notice under the Investment Company Act giving interested persons until September 20 to request a hearing upon an application of Schooner Capital Corp., Boston, closed-end, non-diversified investment company, for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company, as defined in the Act. All of the outstanding capital stock of the company formerly Boston Capital Small Business Investment Corporation, was sold by its former parent, Boston Capital Corp., to Asset, Purchase and Management Co., a Massachusetts limited partnership, which transaction received subsequent approval of the Small Business Administration. The company represents, among other things, that as a result of the sale of its capital stock to APM, it will cease to be an investment company under the provisions of the Act, inasmuch as it is not making and does not presently propose to make a public offering of its securities and its outstanding securities are now beneficially owned by fewer than 100 persons. 1/ (Release IC-6709)

VALLEY FORGE FUND. The SEC has issued a notice under the Investment Company Act giving interested persons until September 20 to request a hearing upon an application of Valley Forge Fund, Incorporated, Wayne, Pa., for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. According to the application, in December 1968, the Pennsylvania Securities Commission approved the sale of Fund shares to Pennsylvania residents. The Fund sold shares to 166 residents for a total of \$69,856 without registration under the Federal securities laws. In February 1970, the Fund was advised that it had not complied with the requirement of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and the Securities Act of 1933. Subsequently, pursuant to a shareholder resolution, all of the assets of applicant have been liquidated and distributed to the shareholders who have exchanged their Fund stock certificates for the liquidation value thereof. 1/ (Release IC-6710)

C&S FUND. The SEC has issued a notice under the Investment Company Act giving interested persons until September 20 to request a hearing upon an application of The C&S Investment Fund, Atlanta, Ga. mutual fund, for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. The Fund was established in 1969 by The Citizens and Southern National Bank and was proposed to operate as a collective investment account. In April 1971, the Supreme Court ruled that bank-operated collective investment funds similar to the type contemplated by the Fund are violative of certain provisions of the Federal banking laws. The fund has, therefore, determined to abandon its proposed operations and has withdrawn its registration statement under the Securities Act of 1933 and its application requesting certain exemptions under the Act. The Fund represents that it has not offered or sold any units of participation to the public, has no investors and no assets. 1/ (Release IC-6711)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

WESTERN MASS. ELECTRIC. The SEC has issued a notice under the Holding Company Act giving interested persons until September 27 to request a hearing upon an application of Western Massachusetts Electric Company, West Springfield subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, to issue and sell 200,000 shares of Series B preferred stock at competitive bidding. Net proceeds will be used to repay short-term borrowings incurred to finance its construction program and expected to aggregate \$35 million at the time of the proposed sales. The parent plans to make a \$5 million capital contribution to further reduce short-term borrowings. Construction expenditures for 1972 are estimated at \$83.2 million. 1/(Release 35-17254)

COLUMBIA GAS. The SEC has issued a notice under the Holding Company Act giving interested persons until September 14 to request a hearing upon an application of The Columbia Gas System, Inc., Wilmington, Del., to issue and sell \$60 million of debentures, due 1996, at competitive bidding. Net proceeds will be added to the company's general funds and, together with funds then available and funds to be generated from operations, will be used to finance, among other things, part of the cost of its subsidiaries' 1971 construction program, estimated at \$235 million. 1/(Release 35-17255)

SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

GENERAL TELEPHONE COMPANY OF THE SOUTHWEST, 2701 South Johnson St., San Angelo, Tex. 76901, filed a registration statement on August 25 seeking registration of \$40 million of first mortgage bonds, due 2001, to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. Net proceeds of its bond sale (together with the proceeds of the proposed sale of 1,600,000 shares of common stock to the parent, at \$25 per share) will be applied to the payment of short-term loans owing to banks and the parent and commercial paper (not to aggregate more than \$123 million at the time of such application), obtained for the purpose of financing the company's construction program. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$96 million for 1971. (File 2-41572)

COMTEN, INC., 1950 West County Road B-2, St. Paul, Minn. 55113, filed a registration statement on August 26 seeking registration of 487,000 shares of common stock. Of these shares 320,000 are to be offered for subscription by common stockholders, at the rate of one share for each five shares held and at \$7.50 per share. The remaining shares are to be offered to certain holders of notes at \$8 per share upon conversion of \$1,336,000 of outstanding notes. The company is engaged in the development, manufacture, marketing and maintenance of computers specifically designed for the communications field. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$872,609 will be used to eliminate notes payable to COMRESS, Inc. (holders of 42% of the company's outstanding stock), \$946,000 to reduce other indebtedness and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. (File 2-41575)

ARTHUR RICHARDS, LTD., 120 Fifth Ave., New York 10011, filed a registration statement on August 26 seeking registration of 100,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale (\*at \$6 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Clayton Securities Corp., 50 Broadway, New York 10004. The company is engaged in the design, manufacture and sale of men's suits and sport jackets. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$250,000 will be used to repay outstanding bank loans and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. (File 2-41576)

MOHASCO INDUSTRIES, INC., 57 Lyon St., Amsterdam, N.Y. 12010, filed a registration statement on Aug. 26 seeking registration of 740,723 shares of common stock. It is proposed to offer these shares to common stockholders, at the rate of one share for each seven shares held (\*and at \$39 per share maximum). Unsubscribed shares are to be offered for public sale by underwriters headed by Morgan Stanley & Co., Inc., 140 Broadway, New York 10005. The company is engaged in the production and distribution of carpets, carpet cushions and furniture. Net proceeds will be used to reduce the company's revolving credit notes (\$24 million at July 3) and for working capital and other corporate purposes. (File 2-41577)

SAXTON PRODUCTS, INC., 215 North Route 303, Congers, N.Y. 10920, filed a registration statement on August 26 seeking registration of 190,000 shares of common stock, of which 140,000 are to be offered for public sale by the company and 40,000 (being outstanding shares) by the holder thereof. The offering is to be made (\*at \$14 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by W.E. Hutton & Co., 14 Wall St., New York 10005. The company designs, manufactures and sells television, high-fidelity and telephone wire, cable and related components. Net proceeds of its stock sale will be used to repay a 6½% demand note and outstanding bankers' acceptances (aggregating \$505,391 at July 31) and for working capital and other corporate purposes. JOSEPH E. SEAGRAM & SONS, INC., 375 Park Ave., New York 10022, filed a registration statement on Aug. 26 seeking registration of \$50 million of debentures, due 1996, (guaranteed unconditionally by Distillers Corp.-Seagrams Limited), to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by Loeb, Rhoades & Co., 42 Wall St., and Goldman, Sachs & Co., 55 Broad St., both of New York. The company is primarily engaged in the production and marketing of distilled spirits and wines. Net proceeds of its financing will be used for the reduction of short-term borrowings and to increase working capital. (File 2-41579)

CORNWALL TIN & MINING CORP., 8 King St., East, Toronto, Ont., Can., filed a registration statement on August 26 seeking registration of 300,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale (\*at \$6 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by L.C. Wegard & Co., Inc., U.S. Highway 130 & Levitt Parkway, Willingboro, N.J. 08046. Organized in 1968, the company is engaged in exploring for minerals in Cornwall, England. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$375,000 will be used to repay bank loans, proceeds of which were used for exploration and development expenses and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. LOGIC CORPORATION, 21 Olney Ave., Cherry Hill Industrial Park, Cherry Hill, New Jersey 08034, filed a registration statement on August 26 seeking registration of 477,301 shares of capital stock, of which 424,000 are to be offered for public sale by the company and 53,301 (being outstanding shares) by the holders thereof. Net proceeds of its stock sale will be used for general corporate purposes and capital expenditures, including the \$1.3 million estimated remaining cost of improvements to the Sturgeon Bay shipyard and the relocation of the Manitowoc shipyard operations to Sturgeon Bay.
