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CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

COMPLAINT NAMES WILLIAM W. TAYLOR

The New York Regional Office announced that on February 18 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against William W. Taylor of Trenton, New Jersey. The complaint charges Taylor with violating antifraud provisions and margin provisions of the securities laws by placing orders for the purchase of various option contracts and money market funds without intending to pay for the purchases and failing to make timely and proper payment for the purchases.

The complaint alleges that from June 1980 through January 1981, Taylor, using accounts at eight brokerage firms located in four states, purchased options and money market funds representing a total purchase cost of approximately \$385,000. The complaint further alleges that Taylor did not intend to make payment for these purchases, and to date has made payment at only one brokerage firm where it was to his pecuniary benefit to do so. The Commission's complaint seeks a Temporary and Permanent Injunction, as well as other equitable relief, against Taylor.

On February 27, the court issued a Temporary Restraining Order to prevent further violations of the securities laws as charged in the complaint and to freeze the assets of the defendant pending the determination of the Commission's Motion for a Preliminary Injunction. (SEC v. William Wallace Taylor, S.D.N.Y., 81 Civil 0966 [LWP]). (LR-9318)

ROGER MAGGIO CONSENTS

IN CABLE TELEVISION TAX SHELTER INJUNCTIVE ACTION

The New York Regional Office announced that on February 26 a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Order for Other Equitable Relief by Consent (Judgment and Order) was signed by the Honorable Morris E. Lasker, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of New York, against Roger H. Maggio, permanently enjoining him from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Maggio consented to the entry of the Judgment and Order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint.

The Commission's complaint alleges that Maggio and others violated the aforementioned provisions of the securities laws in connection with the offer and sale to over 700 investors of approximately \$88,100,000 worth of unregistered securities in the form of tax sheltered investment interests in cable television systems.

Earlier, 22 defendant companies of which Maggio is alleged to be a principal, as well as two other alleged principals, also consented to the entry of Judgments and Orders against them without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. (SEC v. Cable/Tel Corp., et al., S.D.N.Y., 80 Civil 7170 MEL). (LR-9319)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

THOMAS A. SARTAIN, OTHERS CONVICTED

The San Francisco Branch Office announced that on February 27 Thomas A. Sertain, James D. Lang, Jr., and Michael J. Scotto, were found guilty of eight counts of mail fraud by a jury in the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California, after a six-week trial. Sentencing is scheduled for March 26, 1981.

Based upon the same facts which underlay the criminal prosecution each defendant had been permanently enjoined, with his consent, by the same federal district court in June 1976, from future violations of the securities laws. Sartain has also been barred by the Commission from being associated with any broker or dealer. (U.S. v. Thomas A. Sartain, et al., N.D. Cal., Criminal Action No. CR-79-0335-SAW). (LR-9320)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

TRUST FOR CASH MANAGEMENT
