CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

AMENDED COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST OTC NET INCORPORATED, OTHERS

The Denver Regional Office announced on June 23 the filing of an amended complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado alleging that OTC Net Incorporated, Juan Carlos Schidlowski, Joseph V. Pignatiello, Kim D. Rust, Delmar D. Hartley, Otecenet S.A., and Arlan I. Preblud violated, and aided and abetted the violation of various provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, in connection with, among other things, the underwriting and aftermarket trading in the securities of five issuers. The amended 20-count complaint alleges, among other things, that the defendants variously violated the antifraud, antimanipulative and registration provisions, as well as the net capital and customer reserve protection rules, books and records, reporting and notice requirement of the securities laws. In addition to seeking injunctive relief, the Commission also seeks an order requiring, among other things, that Otecenet, Preblud, Schidlowski, Rust and Pignatiello account for and disgorge, if appropriate, certain profit resulting from the continuing distribution of the common stock of Balboa Exploration.

The original complaint was filed on June 3, and a temporary restraining order, expiring at 2:00 p.m. on June 9, was entered by consent by the Honorable Zita Wienshienk, Judge, U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado. On June 9, OTC Net, Schidlowski and Pignatiello consented to the extending of the temporary restraining order until and through June 18, and OTC Net to the appointment of a SIPC trustee. On June 17 OTC Net, Schidlowski and Pignatiello consented to extending the temporary restraining order filed on June 3 until July 2. (SEC v. OTC Net Incorporated, et al., USDC, Colo., Civil Action No. 82-Z-877). (LR-9709)

JOHN A. STRANGIS TEMPORARILY ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office (CRO) announced that on June 17 the Honorable Diana E. Murphy, Judge, U.S. District Court for the District of Minnesota, Fourth Division at Minneapolis, entered a temporary restraining order against John A. Strangis. The order enjoins the defendant from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws, and freezes his assets pending the appointment of a receiver.

In its complaint filed June 16, the CRO alleged that Strangis, until recently a principal of Minneapolis registered broker-dealer Alstead, Strangis and Dempsey, Inc. (ASD), defrauded investors in several states through the offer and sale of securities. The complaint alleged that Strangis offered to sell investors securities purportedly ordered by ASD customers, but not paid for by such customers. Strangis guaranteed investors high returns within a short period of time. In some instances, Strangis initially paid returns, then requested and received additional contributions from investors, which he did not repay.

The complaint further alleged that Strangis obtained money from an investor by offering to deposit the investor's money into a bank account, and guaranteeing a high return within one year. Also, the CRO alleged that Strangis offered to sell shares of stock to certain investors, guaranteeing a high return. Strangis failed to make any returns on those investments, and failed to deliver any securities to those investors. (SEC v. John A. Strangis, D. Minn., Civil Action No. 4-82-866). (LR-9711)

JOHN H. TURNER ENJOINED; OTHER RELIEF ORDERED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on June 30 the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania entered a temporary restraining order with the consent of defendant (1) temporarily restraining John H. Turner of Greenville, Pennsylvania, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in connection with the offer, purchase and sale of securities, (2) freezing the assets and property of the defendant, except for ordinary living expenses, and (3) ordering an accounting of all investor funds. The Commis-

sion's complaint alleged violations of these provisions of the securities laws in connection with the offer and sale of over \$861,000 of fractional interests in non-existent certificates of deposit sold to over 56 investors. The complaint further alleges that the defendant made untrue statements of material fact and failed to state material facts including that the defendant had not purchased the certificates of deposit, had converted investor funds to his own benefit and use and falsely claimed that the investments were tax-free and guaranteed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. On July 2 the Court entered a Final Judgment and Order permanently enjoining the defendant from further violations of the above-mentioned securities laws and also entered an Order Freezing the defendant's assets and ordering an accounting. The defendant consented to these orders without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint. (SEC v. John H. Turner, W.D. Pa., Civil Action No. 82-1251). (LR-9712)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

MARKHAM GUILTY OF ALL COUNTS OF 21-COUNT INFORMATION

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on June 12, in Spokane, Washington, a Spokane County Superior Court jury returned guilty verdicts against Lawrence D. Markham, a former resident of Spokane, on nine counts of fraud in connection with the offer and sale of a security, nine counts of first degree theft, conspiracy to commit fraud in connection with the offer and sale of security, conspiracy to commit theft in the first degree, and sale of unregistered securities. Two other defendants, Harold A. Kunz and Phillip M. Stephan of Spokane, entered guilty pleas to one count of fraud in connection with the offer and sale of security, prior to the trial of Markham, and in addition agreed to reimbursement of 150 investors whose investments totaled approximately \$1,800,000.

The 24 counts of the Information charged that the defendants, principals of four corporations, had sold investment contracts for the sale and leaseback of personal property, primarily vending machines. The defendants operated a Ponzi scheme using new investors' funds to make lease payments to earlier investors, without disclosing that the equipment purchased by the investors either had not been purchased or had not been delivered to the lessees. The related corporations are presently under the jurisdiction of a Federal Bankruptcy Court. (State of Washington v. Lawrence David Markham, Harold Arthur Kunz, and Phillip Michael Stephan, Superior Court of Washington, Spokane County, Information No. 81-1-00356-8). (LR-9710)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

JEFFERSON-PILOT MONEY MARKET FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 30 to request a hearing on an application by Jefferson-Pilot Money Market Fund, Inc. (Applicant), for an order pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 exempting Applicant from the provisions of Section 2(a)(41) of the Act and Rules 2a-4 and 22c-1 thereunder, to the extent necessary to permit Applicant's price per share for purposes of sales, redemptions and repurchases to be calculated by using the amortized cost method of valuation. GULF POWER COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 30 to request a hearing on a proposal by Gulf Power Company, subsidiary of The Southern Company, to amend its charter to (1) create a new series of preferred stock with a par value of

\$10 and (2) modify certain provisions relating to calculation of net income available for dividends and gross income available for interest. Gulf Power also proposes to request authorization of its preferred stockholders to issue or assume unsecured securities until July 1, 1989 having maturities of less than 10 years in excess of 10 percent of capital, surplus and secured debt with certain provisions. Gulf Power also proposes to solicit proxies in connection with the above. (Rel. 35-22566 - July 7)

SOUTHWESTERN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY

NOTICE OF AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed an amendment to a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-Phlx-81-1) to define the term "unsatisfactory performance" as used in proposed Rules 503 and 504 concerning unacceptable specialist performance, and to implement proposed rules 501 through 505 on a two year pilot basis beginning October 1, 1982. Publication of the amendment is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 12. (Rel. 34-18868)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Philadelphia Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-Phlx-82-6) which would modify its floor procedure for controlling the number of registered options traders in a trading crowd who are establishing or increasing a position. NOTICE OF FILING AND ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed, and the Commission has approved, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change pursuant to Rule 19b-4 (SR-Amex-82-10) to delete the spousal exemption in Amex Rule 420, relating to mailing statements, confirmations and communications to customers. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 12. (Rel. 34-18872)

NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF AMENDMENT TO CTA PLAN

The Consolidated Tape Association Plan (CTA Plan) participants have submitted an amendment to the CTA Plan which became effective upon filing, pursuant to Rule 11Aa3-2(a)(3) under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The amendment, among other things, applies a uniform first unit rate for Network A ticker display service to all Canadian provinces equal to the lowest rate in the present Canadian rate scale, and raises by 12.8 percent the rate for additional ticker display units throughout Canada.
