STEPHEN W. MURPHY ORDERED TO SHOW CAUSE REGARDING CRIMINAL CONTEMPT

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on May 11 the Honorable Lawrence Lydick of the U.S. District Court for the Central District of California granted the Commission's application and entered an Order against Stephen W. Murphy to show cause why he should not be punished for criminal contempt for violations of a prior injunction entered against him. The Order requires Murphy to appear on June 21 at 9:30 a.m. in Los Angeles, California. Murphy was permanently enjoined from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in *SEC v. Intertie, Inc., et al.* [see LR-8603, November 21, 1978].

The Commission's application alleges that Murphy violated the prior injunction in the offer and sale of \$483,000 of limited partnership interests to 23 investors from November 1979 through February 1980. The Commission's application alleges that the documents used to offer and sell the limited partnership interests contained false and misleading statements and omitted to state material facts concerning, among other things, the use of investors' funds and the commingling of investors' funds with the funds of other business entities controlled by Murphy. The application further alleges that Murphy misappropriated to his own use and benefit a substantial portion of the proceeds raised from investors. (*SEC v. Stephen W. Murphy*, USDC CD CA, Civil Action No. 75-2775-LTL). (LR-9999)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JAMES MASSA AND DUANE SKINNER FOUND GUILTY

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on April 28 a Federal jury in St. Louis, Missouri, found James Massa, an Illinois attorney, and Duane Skinner, a certified public accountant, guilty of a total of 42 counts relating to the \$16 million looting of Stix & Co. Inc., formerly a St. Louis broker-dealer, now in proceedings under the Securities Investor Protection Act. Massa was found guilty of one conspiracy charge, 12 counts of mail fraud, six counts of wire fraud, five counts of securities fraud and five counts of aiding and abetting a broker-dealer in maintaining false books and records. Skinner was found guilty of one conspiracy charge, eight counts of mail fraud and four counts of causing forged checks to be transported across state lines. Massa faces a maximum prison sentence of 145 years and Skinner faces a maximum prison sentence of 90 years. U.S. District Court Judge Nangle set May 27 as the sentencing date for both defendants. (*U.S. v. James Massa, et al.*, U.S.D.C. E.D. Mo., Eastern Division, 82-277CR(2)). (LR-9998)

EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A rule change filed by The Depository Trust Company under Rule 19b-4 (SR-DTC-83-3) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The rule change revises DTC's current fees for certain major services so that the fees more accurately reflect DTC's cost. The rule change adds a new fee schedule for registered municipal bond services that is lower than the previous schedule applicable to all (bearer and registered) municipal bond services. The rule change also adds two new fees for certain money adjustments made during settlement and for late deliver orders. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 16. (Rel. 34-19769)

ACQUISITIONS OF SECURITIES

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
