U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

RICHARD A. CHEPUL CITED

The Commission announced that it has instituted administrative proceedings under Rule 2(e)(3) of its Rules of Practice against Richard A. Chepul, a certified public accountant residing in Whiteville, North Carolina, and accepted his offer of settlement. The proceedings arise out of an injunctive action brought by the Commission against Chepul and others in 1979 [SEC v. Youmans, 543 F. Supp. 1292, E.D. Tenn 1982]. In that action the district court found that Chepul, as vice president and secretary-treasurer of Hamilton Bancshares, Inc., a now bankrupt Tennessee bank holding company, violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b), 13(a) and 14(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1, 13a-11, 13a-13 and 14a-9. The Court enjoined him from future violations of those provisions.

In his offer of settlement, Chepul consents to a 90-day suspension from practice before the Commission as an accountant, including such practice as an employee of a public company or otherwise, and agrees that for the year following the Commission's order he will submit work done by him for inclusion in documents filed with the Commission by a reporting company to the company's senior officers, independent auditors or counsel for review and approval. He also states that he will seek the Commission's approval if he wishes to practice before it as an independent certified public accountant within that year. In addition Chepul has agreed to dismiss his appeal from the permanent injunction entered against him in the Commission's enforcement action and to continue to comply with that injunction.

The Commission's Order suspends Chepul from appearing or practicing before it for a period of 90 days and orders him to comply with the undertakings in his offer of settlement. (Rel. 33-6473)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

BARRY T. GRIFFITH AND THOMAS P. GRIFFITH ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on June 23 the U.S. District Court in Atlanta, Georgia, enjoined Barry T. Griffith of Overland Park, Kansas, and on July 7 enjoined Thomas P. Griffith of Jacksonville, North Carolina, from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

The complaint, filed on June 23, alleged that on November 30, 1979, B. Griffith purchased 1,500 shares and T. Griffith purchased 5,000 shares of Aeronca, Inc. common stock as a result of non-public information of a debt restructuring and loan commitment which resulted in a change in the net worth of Aeronca Inc. from a negative \$1.50 to a positive \$1.20, a net increase of \$2.70 per share.

Both defendants were ordered to disgorge all profits from the transactions, \$3,687 by B. Griffith and \$17,775 by T. Griffith. The defendants consented to the relief requested without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint. Persons who sold Aeronca, Inc. common shares to either defendant on or about November 30, 1979 may petition the Court between July 7, 1983 and January 2, 1984 by filing claims with the Registry of the Court, Clerk's Office - Financial Intake Section, U.S. District Court, Northern District of Georgia, 75 Spring Street, S.W., Atlanta, GA 30303. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The following have filed proposed rule changes under Rule 19b-4: The Midwest Securities Trust Company (SR-MSTC-83-10); and The Midwest Clearing Corporation (SR-MCC-83-2) which would effect changes in MSTC's and MCC's rules to conform with the Division of Market Regulation's standards for full registration of clearing agencies. The changes would: (a) limit the power to waive or suspend rules and procedures to a 60-day period unless approved by the Board of Directors within that period; (b) expand the categories of sanctions available to MSTC and MCC to include all the sanctions enumerated in Section 17A(b)(3)(G) of the Act; (c) increase the number of days during which a participant may request a review of decision imposing disciplinary sanctions; (d) stay sanctions, other than summary suspension, upon a participant's request for a review of disciplinary action; (e) require that directors involved in a review or appeal concerning participant sanctions will be disinterested in the matter; (f) require MSTC and MCC promptly to notify their participants and other clearing agencies of any proposed rule changes filed with the Commission; and (g) require MSTC and MCC to notify affected persons that they have ceased to act for a participant by, among other methods, telephone, cable or similar medium.
