ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

VAS CENSURED WITH LIMITATIONS ON ITS ACTIVITIES; PRINCIPALS SUSPENDED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings against and simultaneously accepted Offers of Settlement from Verrilli, Altschuler, Schwartz, Inc. (VAS), a registered New York broker-dealer, and its principals, M. Richard Verrilli, Stanley Altschuler and Stephen Schwartz. The Commission found that VAS and its principals wilfully violated the registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 in the sale of Massive Energy Limited and Quality Care, Inc. securities and that VAS wilfully violated and the principals wilfully aided and abetted violations of the anti-fraud and disclosure of control provisions of the Exchange Act and Rule 15c1-5 by failing to disclose their control of Massive. The Commission also: suspended VAS' principals from association with any broker-dealer for six months; censured VAS; limited VAS' retail sales, market making activities and participation in offerings of unregistered securities for six months; and ordered VAS to comply with certain undertakings. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

STEVEN R. BABBIDGE AND ASSOCIATES AND STEVEN R. BABBIDGE ENJOINED

The Los Angeles Regional Office announced that on August 29 and August 31, respectively, Senior Judge Irving Hill, U.S. District Court for the Central District of California, entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against Steven R. Babbidge (Babbidge) and Steven R. Babbidge and Associates (Babbidge and Associates)

for violations of the registration and the antifraud provisions of the securities laws.

The complaint alleged that Babbidge and Associates and its sold proprietor, Babbidge, in the sale of interests in a limited partnership, Midland Associates, misstated and omitted to state material facts regarding the: risks involved in the investment; use of proceeds from the sale of the securities; financial condition of Babbidge and Associates; compensation paid to the defendants from the sale of the securities; and amount of profit that the investors could expect from the investment. The complaint also alleges that no registration statement respecting the securities sold by the defendants was filed with the Commission. Babbidge and Associates and Babbidge consented to the Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations. (SEC v. Steven R. Babbidge and Associates and Steven R. Babbidge, USDC CD CA, Civil Action No. 84-4130 [IH]). (LR-10534)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JAMES MASIELLO SENTENCED

The New York Regional Office announced that on September 6 U.S. District Judge John M. Cannella, Southern District of New York, sentenced James Masiello to 15 years imprisonment, fines totalling \$110,000 and \$248,000 restitution on his conviction following a jury verdict on May 4, for 11 counts of interstate transportation of money and securities that were stolen and obtained by fraud. Masiello was previously charged in two civil injunctive actions filed by the NYRO [SEC v. Memme 73 Civ. 3438 (S.D.N.Y.) (RLC) and SEC v. E.J. Albanese and Co., Inc., 76 Civ. 4788 (S.D.N.Y.) (EW)]. He consented to permanent injunctions without admitting or denying the allegations in the staff's complaints.

The jury found that Masiello; beginning in 1980, devised and executed schemes to defraud by inducing his victims to give him money and securities on the false representation that he was posting an equal amount; would use these monies and securities as collateral to secure stock trading from which the victims would receive 50% of the profits; and would pay his victims' bills and manager their financial affairs. In fact, Masiello took the money and securities for his own purposes.

Masiello, who has been incarcerated since May 14, was remanded to serve his sentence. (LR-10530)
