REQUEST FOR REARGUMENT DENIED

The Commission determined to deny relief requested by ORS Automation, Inc. (ORSI). By order dated May 23, the Commission dismissed ORSI's appeal of a National Association of Securities Dealers, Inc.'s (NASD) decision to deny a motion for a stay of an NASD subcommittee ruling to terminate the National Market System designation of ORSI's common stock. The Commission denied ORSI's subsequent request for reargument of its appeal. (Rel. 34-23265)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FINAL CONSENT JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST SAMUEL RUBENSTEIN

The New York Regional Office announced that on May 29 Judge Milton Pollack, U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, entered a Final Consent Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Samuel Rubenstein, former Chief Financial Officer of Puritan Fashions Corporation, enjoining him from violating the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. Rubenstein consented to the injunction without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint.

Pursuant to a Stipulated Settlement and Undertaking, the Court ordered Andrew Rosen, former Puritan Chief Executive Officer, to comply with his undertaking not to violate the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The complaint alleges that in late 1983, Rubenstein, as trustee of the Puritan Fashions Pension Trust, directed the Trust to sell 35,156 shares of Puritan stock while possessing material, non-public information concerning Puritan's declining sales and earnings. The sum of \$150,000, representing losses avoided by Rubenstein's trading, has been deposited with the Court by or on behalf of the Trust. The complaint further alleges that they failed to update a sales and earnings projection which had become misleading and released a Puritan shareholder letter containing false and misleading statements about Puritan's profitability.

The action is continuing against the remaining defendants. (SEC v. Ronald Hengen, et al., 86 Civ. 306 [MP], SDNY). (LR-11113)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JOHN GIURA PLEADS GUILTY

The New York Regional Office announced that on May 23 John Giura pled guilty in federal district court to three counts of an indictment charging him with attempting to obstruct an SEC investigation and with perjury committed before the SEC staff.

Giura, a former partner in Stein Roe & Farnham, admitted that he sought to obstruct the Commission's investigation by repeatedly urging a Florida broker-dealer to lie in his testimony before the staff concerning the reasons why he directed Stein Roe's advisory clients' brokerage to the Florida broker-dealer and the reasons for payments to two individuals from upstate New York. Giura also pled guilty to committing perjury before the SEC by falsely denying that he had spoken to the broker-dealer about his testimony before the staff.

Giura faces a maximum possible prison term of 15 years and a fine of \$750,000 when is is sentenced by Judge Kevin Thomas Duffy on July 21. (U.S. v. John Giura, 85 Cr. 637 KTD, SDNY). (LR-11112)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

PAINWEBBER MASTER SERIES, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 20 to request a hearing on an application of PaineWebber Master Series, Inc. (formerly PaineWebber Special Income Fund) for an order permitting the assessment (variation and waiver) of a contingent deferred sales load and permitting the assessment of a service charge on certain offers of exchange. An order has been issued granting an application of Freedom Investment Trust for contingent deferred sales loads and quarterly distributions of certain long-term capital gains. (Rel. IC-15118 - May 28)

RAND CAPITAL CORPORATION, et al.

An order has been issued pursuant to Sections 17(b) and 17(d) of the Act, and Rule 17d-1 thereunder, permitting Rand Capital Corporation, Rand SBIC, Inc. and Morris Himmel to effect an affiliated transaction. (Rel. IC-15119 - May 29)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

MIDDLE SOUTH ENERGY, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Middle South Energy, Inc. (MSE), subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, to enter into a Fifth Amendment to the Credit Agreement used to finance the obligations of MSE relating to the nuclear fuel and facilities incident to its use, to be used in Unit No. 1 at MSE's Grand Gulf Nuclear Generating Station. The Fifth Amendment to the Credit Agreement will eliminate references to Libor Rate Loans, change the interest rate payable on any future credit loans to 125% of the Base Rate, change the penalty interest rate on future drawings under the Letter of Credit or under the revolving credit loans to 135% of the Base Rate, and amend the definition of the "Termination Date" in the Credit Agreement. Concurrently, MSE and Port Gibson will amend the Lease to provide that the Lease will also terminate on the amended Termination Date. (Rel. 35-24108 - May 28)

A supplemental order has been issued regarding Middle South Utilities, Inc., a registered holding company, its subsidiary MSE and its operating subsidiaries authorizing certain amendments to MSE's domestic and foreign bank loan agreements. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the issuance and pledge by MSE of Collateral Bonds. (Rel. 35-24110 - May 28)

MISSISSIPPI POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Mississippi Power & Light Company (MP&L), subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to issue notes up to a maximum principal amount of \$75.2 million. (Rel. 35-24109 - May 28)

An order has been issued authorizing MP&L to issue and sell up to \$115 million of first mortgage bonds, and 350,000 shares of preferred stock, cumulative, \$100 par value. (Rel. 35-24111 - May 28)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

PLITT THEATRES, INC.

An order has been issued under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Plitt Theatres, Inc. that the trusteeship of Bankers Trust Company under two Plitt indentures is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify the Bank from acting as trustee under either indenture.
