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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

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COMMENTS REQUESTED ON NEW RULE 430A, AMENDMENTS TO RULES 424(b) and 497,  
AND OTHER AMENDMENTS TO RULE 424

The Commission published for comment: (a) new Rule 430A under the Securities Act of 1933 and related amendments to Items 512 and 601 of Regulation S-K, which, if promulgated, will eliminate the filing of many pricing amendments by permitting registration statements to be declared effective without disclosing the price, certain price-related information and information concerning the underwriting syndicate; (b) amendments to Rules 424(b) and 497 to require more immediate filing of the prospectus used after effectiveness of a registration statement permitted by proposed Rule 430A; and (c) other amendments to Rule 424 to reduce the filing period for other prospectuses used after effectiveness, eliminate unnecessary filings, and classify Rule 424(b) prospectuses more systematically.

Comments must be received 45 days after publication of the release in the Federal Register and should refer to File No. S7-28-86. 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### NEW 1940 ACT APPLICATION FORMAT

The Division of Investment Management has proposed a standard format for publishing Notices of Filing of Applications for Exemptions under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The new format will make the Notices shorter and easier to read and research, and provide new information on the staff members who are working on the applications, how to request hearings, and how to obtain the full application. Counsel filing these Applications should prepare their accompanying draft Notices in the new format. The new format will be available by following the examples of future 1940 Act Notices that will appear in the SEC Docket and Federal Register.

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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST JAMES R. ANDERSON AND FRANK COOPER

The Seattle Regional Office filed a Complaint for Permanent Injunction on September 30 in the U.S. District Court in Portland against James R. Anderson and Frank Cooper, both of Portland and former president and director, respectively, of American Guaranty Financial Corp., an Oregon corporation. The Injunction alleges violations of Sections 13(a) and 14(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Defendants allegedly did not disclose certain material facts on American Guaranty's Form 10-K for 1980 through 1982 nor in its proxy material for 1980, 1982, and 1983. Not disclosed were certain related party transactions and Anderson's ownership in a subsidiary of American Guaranty. The Commission seeks Permanent Injunctions against both defendants. (SEC v. James R. Anderson and Frank Cooper, USDC DOR, File No. C-86-1217DA). (LR-11260)

The San Francisco Branch Office filed a complaint on September 26 in the federal district court in San Francisco seeking permanent injunctions against Vernon G. Ash, R. Ervin Ash, Robert E. Cheney, James G. Farmer and Telcom Communications, Inc. The complaint charges V. Ash, Cheney, Farmer and Telcom with stock registration violations stemming from their alleged unregistered issuance and distribution, through Telcom, of interests in limited partnerships. The four are also charged, along with R. Ash, with violations of antifraud provisions in connection with, among other things, the alleged misappropriation of about \$2 million in investor funds and the making of material misrepresentations concerning the operating and financial condition of Telcom and the partnerships. In addition, Farmer is named for failing to register as a broker-dealer in connection with the sale of the limited partnership interests. (SEC v. Vernon G. Ash, et al., Civ. No. C-86-5531-DLJ, NDCA). 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## INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### SPAREKASSEN SDS

An order has been issued exempting Sparekassen SDS, a Danish bank, and SDS North America Inc., its subsidiary, from all provisions of the Investment Company Act to permit their issuance of debt securities in the United States. (Rel. IC-15366 - Oct. 23)

### SAASTOPANKKIEN KESKUS-OSAKE-PANKKI

An order has been issued exempting Saastopankkien Keskus-Osake-Pankki and a proposed wholly-owned United States subsidiary from all provisions of the Investment Company Act in connection with the proposed issuance and sale of commercial paper notes and other debt securities in the United States. 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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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### NORTHEAST UTILITIES; MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

Notices have been issued giving interested persons until November 10 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following companies under the same release: Northeast Utilities (NU) - a registered holding company, and its subsidiaries, Western Massachusetts Electric Company, The Quinnehtuk Company, The Connecticut Light and Power Company, Northeast Utilities Service Company, and Northeast Nuclear Energy Company (collectively, Applicants). Applicants request authorization from December 31, 1986 through December 31, 1988 for: (a) short-term borrowings by Applicants, other than Quinnehtuk, in the form of bank notes by open lines of credit and commercial paper; (b) open account advances by NU to its subsidiaries; and (c) the continued use of the NU System Money Pool. Applicants further request that the issuance and sale of the commercial paper be excepted from the competitive bidding requirements of Rule 50 under subparagraph (a)(5); and Middle South Utilities, Inc. (MSU) - a registered holding company, whereby its subsidiary, Middle South Services, Inc. (Services), would enter into computer equipment leasing arrangements with a nonaffiliated lessor and MSU would guarantee the performance by Services of its lease obligations without recourse to Services first being required. 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### UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock of one issue which is listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchanges and is reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. ### UNLISTED TRADING SOUGHT

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 12 to comment on the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in nine issues which are listed and registered on one or more other national securities exchanges and are reported in the consolidated transaction reporting system. ## SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

### NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule change have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by: The National Association of Securities Dealers (SR-NASD-86-30) that would make permanent the reporting requirement of Article III, Section 41 of its Rules of Fair Practice. Article III, Section 41 requires NASD members to maintain a record of aggregate "short" positions in NASDAQ securities in all customer and proprietary firm accounts, and to report that information to the NASD on a monthly basis. Data on aggregate short positions received by the NASD will be made publicly available. (Rel. 34-23730); and The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (SR-MSRB-86-13) stating that clearing agents may maintain records of certificate numbers of municipal securities delivered or received on behalf of dealers. (Rel. 34-23735)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of October 20.

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## ACQUISITIONS OF SECURITIES

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Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1).
