TRADING SUSPENSIONS

TRADING SUSPENDED IN THE SECURITIES OF LITAS INTERNATIONAL, INC.

The Commission announced the single ten-day suspension of exchange and over-the-counter trading in the securities of Litas International, Inc. for the period beginning at 9:30 a.m. (EDT) on July 16, 1990 and terminating at 11:59 p.m. (EDT) on July 25, 1990.

The Commission suspended trading in the securities of Litas International, Inc. because it appeared there was lack of adequate and accurate current information concerning its securities and questions that have been raised about the lack of registration of its securities under Section 5 of the Securities Act of 1933, and information concerning, among other things, whether the securities are freely tradeable, the financial condition of Litas International, Inc. and the business prospectus of Litas International, Inc.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

ROBERT E. LANE ENJOINED

The Philadelphia Regional Office announced that, on July 11, Judge Edward Dumbauld of the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania entered a Final Judgment and Order permanently enjoining Robert E. Lane from future violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Lane was also ordered to disgorge \$216,000, together with interest. Payment of the disgorgement was waived based upon Lane's demonstrated inability to pay. Lane consented to the entry of the order without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's Complaint.

The Complaint, filed on July 3, charged that from 1983 to 1989, Lane raised \$438,000 from 42 investors through the fraudulent offer and sale of unregistered securities of BGL, Inc. (BGL). Lane misrepresented that BGL was an investment club formed solely for the purpose of investing in the securities of A.L. Williams Corporation (ALW).

Lane told investors that, by purchasing BGL stock, they could purchase ALW stock at a discount and without a commission charge. In fact, Lane never purchased his ALW stock, instead misappropriating a portion of the funds for his personal benefit and using the remainder to repay earlier investors wishing to liquidate their investments. DEFAULT JUDGMENT AGAINST EUROBOND EXCHANGE LTD.

The Chicago Regional Office announced that, on June 19, U.S. District Court Judge Dickran Tevrizian, of the Central District of California, entered a Default Judgment against Eurobond Exchange Ltd. (Eurobond). The Default Judgment permanently enjoins Eurobond from violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Default Judgment also freezes all of Eurobond's assets and requires it to provide an accounting to the court.

The Commission's Complaint, filed January 25, alleged that Defendant Eurobond offered and sold unregistered Eurobond securities in the form of investment contracts involving leveraged treasury bonds, thereby raising over one million dollars. The Complaint further alleged that Defendant Eurobond made material misrepresentations and omissions concerning, among other things, the risk associated with the investment and the president of Eurobond's prior criminal record. On January 26, Judge Tevrizian entered a Temporary Restraining Order against Eurobond and, on February 5, the Court entered an Order of Preliminary Injunction against Eurobond. [SEC v. Eurobond Exchange Ltd. et al., (C.D. California, Civil Action File No. CV 90-378-DT (GHXX)) (LR-12541)]

TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER GRANTED RE CONTEL CORPORATION

On July 13, 1990, the Commission filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against individuals and/or entities, whose identities are as yet unknown to the Commission, alleging that the defendants, while in possession of material nonpublic information concerning the proposed merger between Contel Corporation (Contel) and GTE Corporation (GTE), purchased common stock and/or call option contracts for Contel common stock in violation of Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Commission alleged that certain defendants traded through brokerage accounts maintained by four Swiss and two German financial institutions at various United States brokerage houses. The trading allegedly resulted in approximately \$1,081,125.00 in unrealized profits on investments of \$205,125.00.

The Court granted the requested Temporary Restraining Order, Order for Freezing Certain Assets, Order for Expedited Discovery, Order Authorizing Alternative Means for Service of Process and Order Preventing Document Alteration or Destruction. Hearing on the Commission's Application for a Preliminary Injunction and Other Equitable Relief is scheduled for July 23, 1990. [SEC v. Certain Purchasers of Common Stock and Call Option Contracts for the Common Stock of Contel Corporation, (USDC for the SDNY, Civil Action No. 90 Civ. 4636 (CSH)) (LR-12542)].

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

GOLDMAN SACHS - INSTITUTIONAL TAX-EXEMPT ASSETS

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 6 to request a hearing on an application filed by Goldman Sachs - Institutional Tax-Exempt Assets for an order under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-17579)

THE SINGAPORE FUND, INC.

A conditional order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 has been issued on an application filed by The Singapore Fund, Inc. The order grants an exemption from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act and Rule 12d3-1 thereunder to the extent necessary to permit applicant to invest in equity or convertible debt securities issued by foreign issuers that derived more than 15% of their gross revenues from their activities as a broker, dealer, underwriter, or investment adviser, provided such investments meet the conditions described in proposed amended Rule 12d3-1. TECHNOLOGY FUNDING PARTNERS III, L.P., ET AL

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 6 to request a hearing on an application filed by Technology Funding Partners III, L.P., Technology Funding Partners IV, An Aggressive Growth Fund, L.P., Technology Funding Inc., and Technology Funding Ltd. for a conditional order under Section 17(d) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Rule 17d-1 thereunder permitting joint investments in securities. IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The American Stock Exchange (SR-AMEX-90-12) filed a proposed rule change, which became effective upon filing under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, to reduce its transaction charge for certain multi-part index options orders. Publication of the notice is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 16. (Rel 34-28193)

TRUST INDENTURE ACT RELEASES

SHELL OIL COMPANY

The Commission has issued an order under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 on an application by Shell Oil Company that the trusteeship of the Bank of New York (BNY), under 7 indentures, pursuant to a merger between BNY (which prior to being renamed upon such merger was Irving Trust Company) and old The Bank of New York (Old BNY), whereby Old BNY was merged into BNY and BNY succeeded Old BNY as trustee under another indenture, is not so likely to involve a material conflict of interest as to make it necessary in the public interest or for the protection of investors to disqualify BNY from acting as trustee under any of the indentures.
