Allen Ferrell is the Greenfield Professor of Securities Law at Harvard Law School and a research associate at the European Corporate Governance Institute. He received his PhD in economics from MIT and his JD from Harvard Law School. He clerked for Judge Silberman on the D.C. Circuit and Justice Kennedy on the Supreme Court of the United States. He has written and consulted widely in the areas of securities regulation and corporate governance. His current research, in conjunction with Martijn Cremers at the Yale School of Management, is focused on corporate governance and firm valuation using an original large-sample dataset of corporate governance arrangements and ownership data starting in 1978. His current research is also focusing on econometric issues surrounding how to calculate damages in securities class action suits.
